

American Coed Pageants was selected as our pageant name because Coed brings to mind and all American girl, one who is a good student, full of enthusiasm for her school and family, and who is preparing herself to become the very best person she can be. We wanted a name that would not be confused with other pageants because our goal from the beginning was to be recognized not only as unique program, but also as one of the best programs available for girls in America. Since 1983, millions of dollars in cash, scholarships and prizes have been awarded to outstanding girls nationwide.

State pageants are held nationwide annually and state winners are selected to represent their states at the national competition each year in Florida and Walt Disney World®. Girls who qualify to compete at the state level must have sponsors. The total sponsor fee is listed on page 15.

Sponsors make it possible for the American Coed Pageant to award to thousands of dollars annually to outstanding girls nationwide. Sponsor fees also help pay for the production of the state and national competitions each year.

The ideals and principles of American Coed Scholarship Program make it a program that families, friends, civic and business groups can be proud to support.

TENTATIVE STATE PAGEANT SCHEDULE

State Pageants are two and a half day events. Below is a typical schedule for pageant weekend:

SPONSOR FEES

What is a sponsor fee?

Your sponsor fee is the cost to enter the queen's competition for your state. See page 15 for your sponsor fee amount and payment due date. All contestants must have sponsors to be in the state pageant. Sponsors' names are listed under the contestants' names in the front section of the state program book. You may have as many sponsors as you need to reach your total sponsor fee, however, no more than five sponsors may be listed under your name in the program book. Sponsors' names must be printed on your printer's card (located on page 15) and mailed into the pageant. Sponsor fees are not refundable.

Why do we need sponsors?

Sponsors help pay for costs of producing the state and national pageants including prizes, cash awards and trophies for award winners, as well as office, staff and judges' expenses.

Who are sponsors?

Anyone may sponsor you by paying all or part of your required sponsor fee. Your family, friends, or business and civic groups may all be considered to help with sponsoring you. Businesses may even use their contribution as tax-deductible advertising. All they need is a cancelled check.

How do I get sponsors?

Sit down with your parents and read and discuss the State Pageant Information Booklet. Be sure you are familiar with this information so you can answer any questions you might be asked about the pageant. Make a list of prospective sponsors including family members, businesses and clubs. Dress up and look your best. Wear your State Finalist Ribbon (enclosed). Have your Pageant Newsletter and "Letter to Prospective Sponsors" (page 3) ready. (If you are contacting several prospective sponsors, make copies of the letter.) Be excited about the pageant experience and it will be contagious.

What do I say to a prospective sponsor?

Tell your prospective sponsor that you have been selected to be a State Finalist and you are trying to raise the sponsor fee necessary to compete in the pageant.

How and when do I pay my sponsor fee?

PAGEANT SCORING

Queens Competition



On pageant weekend, all contestants compete for the state pageant title. Contestants are scored on poise and appearance in formal dress, personal introduction and appearance in interview outfit, and personality during the interview. The contestants with the highest scores in each age division will be announced as top semi-finalists. The state pageant queen and four runners-up for the queen's court will be chosen from the top semi-finalists. The state pageant winner is required and the queen's court members are eligible to compete for the national queen's title. The national pageant will be held Thanksgiving at the Hilton Resort at Walt Disney World.

All contestants will be scored in the following categories:

- 1/3 Poise and Appearance in Eveningwear
- 1/3 Poise and Personality in Interview
- 1/3 Personal Introduction (20 seconds) and Appearance in Interview Outfit

Poise and Appearance in Eveningwear:

(with escorts):

Judges will score contestants on poise and appearance as each contestant is escorted on stage in eveningwear. This is a formal event for contestants and escorts. **No cameras will be allowed in the ballroom.**

Personal Introduction and Appearance in Interview Outfit:

Each contestant will introduce herself to the panel of judges before interviews, giving her name, hometown and a few things she wants the judges to know about herself. Your introduction may last up to twenty seconds. The contestant's age should not be included in her introduction.

Poise and Personality in Interview:

A panel of judges will interview each contestant. This is done in a one-on-one format. Each contestant will spend a few moments with each judge individually. She will be asked questions she can easily answer. She will not be asked questions about politics, religion, dating, etc. Judges will not score contestants on what they know but on their poise, personality, appearance and self-confidence.

Escort

All contestants will need an escort for the eveningwear poise & appearance competition. You may choose anyone you wish and escorts will not be judged. This person may be your father, mother, uncle, brother, boyfriend or whomever you select to be part of your pageant experience. Male escorts must wear a suit with a dress shirt and tie, a military uniform or a conventional tuxedo. Female escorts may wear a nice dress. Rehearsal with escorts is scheduled before eveningwear competition.

An explanation and example of how to escort a contestant on and off stage will be presented during the eveningwear dress rehearsal. It's a very simple process and we will be able to teach your escort very quickly! If you do not have an escort, we will provide an escort for you.

OPTIONAL CONTESTS

Optional contests are offered to contestants on pageant weekend so girls may have a chance to win awards and recognition in several different categories. A special panel of judges scores these contests. Overall judges who select the queen do not see these contests. Optional contests do not count toward winning the queen's title. You do not have to enter these to win the queen's title. All state award winners and runners-up in optional contests are eligible to compete in optional contests offered at the National Pageant in November at Walt Disney World®.

Talent Contest

1. **Must be a live presentation on a stage no larger than 12' X 24'**
2. **Must be two minutes or less**
3. **Must be memorized**
4. **Pageant furnishes microphone, cd player, piano or keyboard.**

Entry Fee: \$50 per performance

All talent contestants will perform and be scored at the talent competition. From these performances, the judges will select the top finalists. The winners of this competition will receive a trophy or plaque and a cash award. Talent performances have a time limit of two minutes. At two minutes a timer will go off and your microphone and/or music will be quickly faded out. The judges will not deduct points if this occurs, but they will stop scoring when your performance reaches two minutes. All performances must be live and memorized. Do not use sheet music if you are playing an instrument. Talent performances and costumes must be conservative and age appropriate. Make-up is allowed in all age divisions during the talent competition. Do not use songs with suggestive lyrics or song titles. The stage will be covered with hardwood dance flooring suitable for all kinds of dance routines, including tap and point. Talent contestants may use props, but please make sure they are small enough for the contestant to handle. Mats for gymnastic routines are allowed. American Coed Pageants will provide a microphone, sound system and sound technician. Please don't hesitate to contact the pageant office if you have any additional needs. If you need music to be played over our sound system during your talent, please bring it on a compact disc marked clearly with your name and age division. Bring an additional copy of your compact disc in case your first copy is lost or damaged. You may enter the talent competition more than once. An entry fee of \$50 must be paid for each talent entry. **No cameras are allowed in the ballroom.**



Speech Contest (select one theme)

1. **“My Favorite American” (must be famous)**
2. **“Youth, Pride of the Present, Hope of the Future” (our company motto)**
3. **“How I Can Make the World a Better Place”**
4. **Poem, Bible verse or other topic allowed in the Princess division only**

Speech entries must be 100 words or less and memorized. Parents and Teachers may help you write your speech.

Entry Fee: \$50 per performance

All speech contestants will perform and be scored at the speech competition. From these performances, the judges will select the top finalists. The winners of this competition will receive a trophy or plaque and a cash award. Speech performances have a strict 100-word limit, counting all words except the title. Bring two typed, double-spaced copies of your speech to turn in at pageant check-in. Your name, age division and number of words must be in the upper right-hand corner of your speech. You may wear your Interview outfit or similar conservative outfit. You may enter the speech competition more than once. An entry fee of \$50 must be paid for each speech entry. **No cameras are allowed in the ballroom.**



Photogenic Contest

Contestants participating in this contest bring the photo of their choice in color or black and white to check-in on pageant weekend. Photogenic photos will be judged on pageant weekend and returned to you.

Entry Fee: \$50 per entry

To enter the photogenic competition, contestants must bring a photo to pageant check-in. From these entries the judges will select the top finalists and winners. Photogenic entries may be head and shoulders, full length, posed, candid, black and white or color. The photo you enter may be any size up to 8" x 10" and it should have been taken within the past year. Make-up is allowed in all age divisions. However, your photogenic entry must emphasize your actual age. The winners of this competition will receive an official trophy or plaque and a cash award. You may enter the photogenic competition more than once. An entry fee of \$50 must be paid for each photogenic entry.



Modeling Contest

Contestants will bring and model an age-appropriate outfit that has a casual, tailored look. Each contestant will have approximately thirty seconds on stage. **Entry Fee: \$50 per performance**

All modeling contestants will perform and be scored at the modeling competition. From these performances, the judges will select the top finalists and winners. This competition will look like a department store fashion show. Contestants will bring and model an age-appropriate outfit that has a casual, tailored look. Your outfit should not be too dressy. Make-up is allowed in all age divisions. No pro-am modeling, such as aerial spins, kicks, or flips, is allowed. The winner of this competition will receive an official trophy or plaque and a cash award. You may enter the modeling competition more than once. An entry fee of \$50 must be paid for each modeling entry. **No cameras are allowed in the ballroom.**



Spirit of America Award

Every contestant who qualifies for the Spirit of America Award will be presented with a beautiful trophy on stage during preliminary eveningwear competition. Contestants must compete in four* of the contests listed below to receive the Spirit of America Award.

1. Talent Competition
2. Speech Competition
3. Photogenic Competition
4. Modeling Competition

*You may substitute entering one competition by entering a different competition two times. For example, you will qualify for the Spirit of America Award if you enter the photogenic competition twice and also enter modeling and talent. There is no additional entry fee for the Spirit of America Award.



Academic Achievement

This competition encourages these contestants to strive for excellence in every area of their school life, including academics, awards, honors, clubs and other activities. On page 11, you will find an **entry form**. This form must be completed and turned in at registration. You must attach a copy of your most recent report card or school transcript to be considered for the academic achievement award. Do not send these forms to our office. Bring them to registration on pageant weekend. Judges will select the contestant who has the best school record, honors, awards and civic and/or church activities. Winners of this contest will receive a trophy or plaque. There is no entry fee for this contest.



Volunteer Service

This award recognizes contestants who help other people without being paid. To be considered for this competition you will need to bring the completed **entry form** located on page 13. You must include a letter verifying your volunteer work from at least one of the organizations you list. Judges will select the contestant who has the best record of community service (helping other people without pay). The winners of this competition will receive a trophy or plaque. There is no entry fee for this contest.



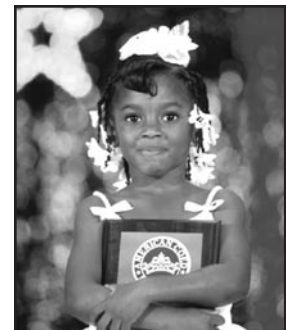
State Hostess Contest and Awards

The contestant in each age division who sells the most advertising for the state program book (minimum of two pages) will win the state hostess title, an official crown, banner, trophy and any other prizes she has earned. Every contestant who sells an advertisement of any size will be recognized and presented with a trophy on pageant weekend.

Hostesses earn their titles through advertising sales. Every state finalist may earn a beautiful official crown and banner with one page of advertising.

Miss Personality

Contestants vote for the girl who is the friendliest, most helpful and the most fun to be around on pageant weekend. The girl who receives the most votes wins the Miss Personality award. There is no entry fee for this contest.



PAGEANT OUTFITS

Official T-Shirt

This t-shirt is worn for the opening production number. Plan to purchase the t-shirt on pageant weekend at check-in. You furnish your own blue jeans, shoes and socks. Please bring ankle socks and tennis shoes or flats that are lightweight, clean and cut below the ankle. Do not wear high top or heavy sneakers. Your shoes and socks should be white. Your t-shirt will cost approximately \$25.



Interview Outfit



Preteens, Sweethearts and Princesses: This outfit should be suitable for church or a dress-up occasion.

Junior Teens, Teens and Coeds: This outfit should be conservative and suitable for a job interview.

All Age Groups: Do not wear a formal dress for interview competition. You may wear sheer or opaque hose. Younger contestants may wear ankle socks. Skirts or pant suits are allowed. Skirt may be no shorter than one inch above the knee.

Eveningwear

You may wear the formal gown of your choice. It may be tea length or longer. White is not required! It may be any color. You will wear the same gown both nights. If you are buying a new evening gown for your state pageant, you may want to follow the national pageant eveningwear rules so that if you qualify for Nationals* you won't have to buy another gown. Don't buy a new formal dress for your state pageant if you already have one or if you can borrow one from a friend. Many of our state queens win in borrowed dresses.

***National Rules:**

Princesses, Sweethearts, Preteens, Junior Teens and Teens:

Your gown should be simple, elegant and appropriate for your age. The hemline of your gown should be floor length. Short trains are allowed. Your shoes should not show when you are standing still, but the skirt should not buckle when you walk. Straight skirts or tight fitting gowns with slits up the side, front or back are discouraged. Gowns may be trimmed or lightly decorated with sequins, beads, pearls or rhinestones, but you should not wear a full sequin or heavily beaded gown. No "hoops."

For Coeds:

Your gown should be elegant. The skirt may be full or straight, but not so tight that you can't walk comfortably in it. The skirt may not have a slit that reaches higher than your knee. Plunging necklines and bare midriffs are discouraged.



Shoes

Your shoes should be dyed to match, clear or should compliment your outfit. Taupe shoes are also acceptable for interviews.

Sweethearts, Princesses and Preteens:

Flat or low heels (under 2"). (Ballet slippers are acceptable with Eveningwear).

Junior Teens, Teens and Coeds:

Heels at least 2"- 3" are recommended.

Makeup

Preteens, Sweethearts and Princesses: If a judge can tell you are wearing makeup, points will be deducted from your score. Judges determine how many points to deduct. It is better to play it safe and not wear any makeup at all since your director may check by using a cotton ball.

Junior Teens, Teens and Coeds: Your makeup should give you a natural, all-American look.

Hairstyle

Hair should be in a neat, conservative style, brushed away from eyes and face. No bushy, fuzzy, bouffant hairstyles. Work for a natural, all-American hairstyle that is easy to manage.

What NOT to Wear!

Do not wear or carry gloves, purses, hats, parasols, plastic jewelry, body or hair glitter, heavy makeup, visible body piercing or tattoos, feathers, flowers, corsages, hoop skirts, big sleeves or large ruffles.

Helpful Hint

Your competition outfits should fit you perfectly. Have your clothing altered to fit, paying special attention to the length of the sleeves, hemline and fit through the torso area.

PHOTO & VIDEO

Parents, **no cameras of any type will be allowed in the ballroom at any time.** We will have professional videographers and photographers at the pageant. Our photographer will be professionally photographing contests both days and the photos will be available for purchase. You will want to treasure these memories for your daughter.

No video cameras will be allowed in the ballroom at any time pageant weekend. We have had many problems in the past with video cameras: cameras that plug in the wall have blown our lighting and sound systems; cameras on shoulders block others view; cameras on tripods block the contestants as they use the aisles. Thus, **no video cameras will be allowed in the ballroom at any time.** We ask your cooperation in this matter. Our videographer will be professionally videotaping all contests both days and the tapes will be available for purchase.

OUR HOST HOTEL

Hotel reservation information for the beautiful hotel that will serve as our host hotel for pageant weekend is enclosed. **Be sure to make your reservation before the cutoff date listed on the hotel information flyer.**

All pageant activities will be held in the ballrooms and other meeting space at the hotel. The hotel offers discounted room rates for contestants, family members and friends. You will receive the pageant rate for the dates shown on the hotel

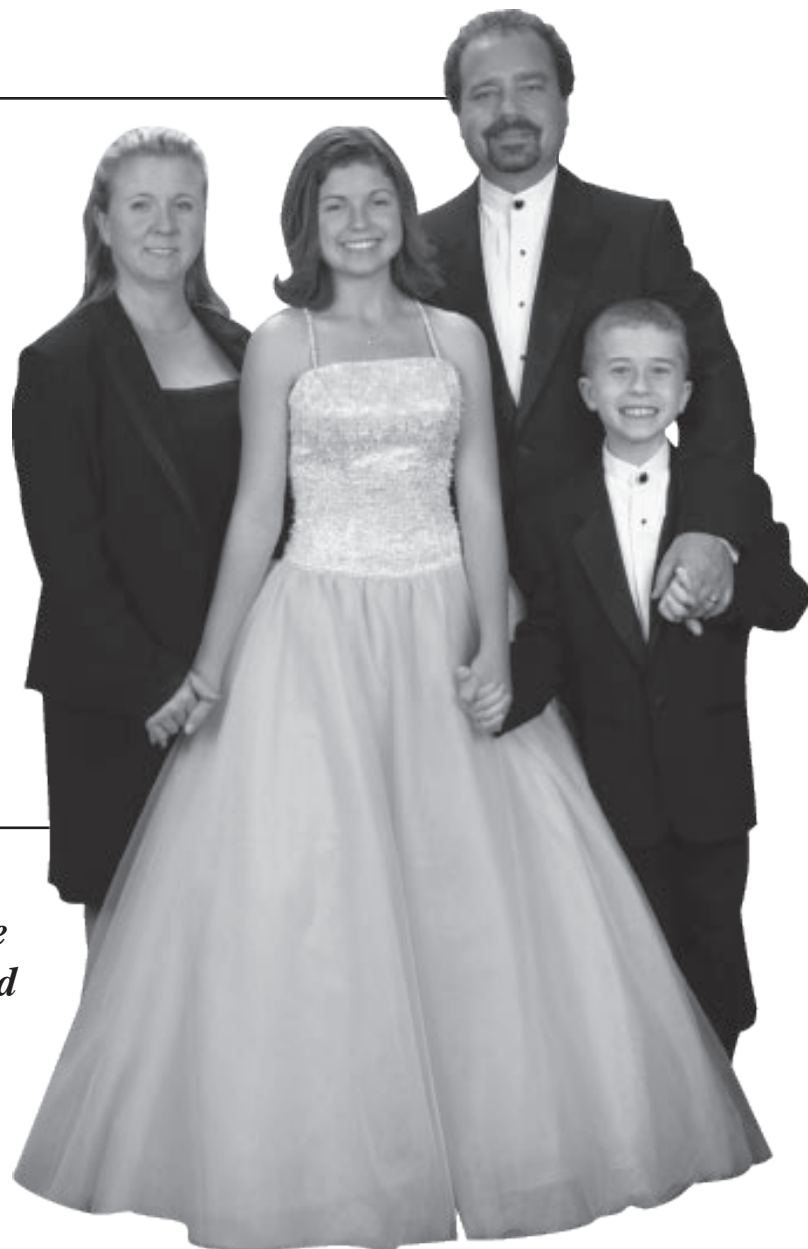
information flyer. You

may reserve a room by calling the hotel directly. We recommend you **do not use the 800 number, unless it is the only one provided**, as that goes to a central hotel office and often they are not aware of our pageant rate.



Dressing Room

A dressing room near the ballroom will be available during the actual pageant on day two. This is a changing room, not a storage room. Neither the hotel nor the Pageant will be responsible for items left in the dressing room. When it is time for the pageant finals, contestants will begin in their official t-shirts. They will take their evening gowns, shoes, etc., to the dressing room before the pageant finals. Outfit changes during the pageant finals will be in the dressing room. No one is allowed in the dressing room except for official pageant chaperones who will help the contestants make a quick outfit change. Mothers, family members, friends, hairdressers, etc., are **not** allowed in the dressing room except for mothers of the contestants in the Princess age division.



You may earn a free hotel room for one or more nights during pageant weekend by participating in our advertising program!

ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT CONTESTS

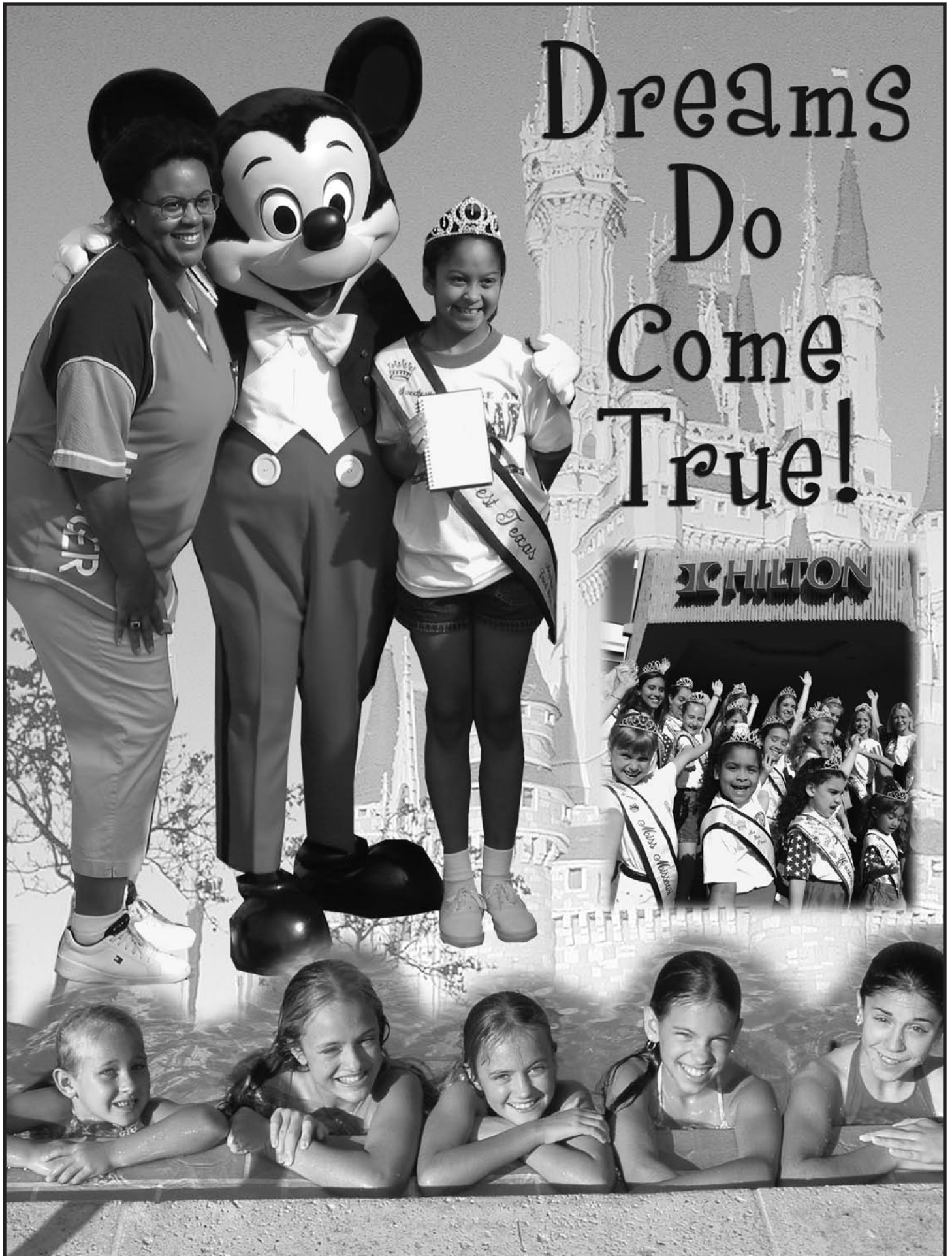

CONTESTANT PHOTO GUIDELINES

- Your photo should be a headshot not full length.
- Background for your photo should be a light, solid color with no props. (This means no flags, scenery, wicker chairs, library books, etc. in background)
